DUE TO STATE LAW, EACH AHJA SHOW IS REQUIRED TO HAVE A CERTIFIED EIA VERIFIER PRESENT AT THE SHOW. THE VERIFIER WILL BE STATIONED AT THE ENTRANCE TO THE SHOW GROUNDS. BEFORE YOU WILL BE ALLOWED TO UNLOAD YOUR HORSE(S), YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO PRESENT AN ORIGINAL CERTIFIED COPY OF A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST DATED WITHIN TWELVE (12) MONTHS OF THE DATE OF THE SHOW FOR EACH HORSE.

The Arkansas Hunter Jumper Association is a group of hunter and jumper riders, trainers, and enthusiasts. AHJA holds 5-6 local shows a year, provides excellent clinic experiences, and allows for many opportunities for interaction and volunteerism in the horse community.

AHJA horse shows promote a friendly atmosphere. Our show courses are measured and are held to USEF standards. Classes range from x-rails through 3' for hunters, and jumper classes are included as well. AHJA members can accumulate points from participation in these show classes that can earn year-end awards which are given at a banque, usually held in January at the beginning of the new show year.

If you have interests similar to those described above, whether you have a horse or are just looking to get involved in the horse community in central Arkansas, we invite you to join us!

We are an affiliate of the United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA), which gives us access to additional awards, grants and opportunities for our members. POST ENTRY: Entries received after the CLOSING DATE will be charged a late fee of \$35 per entry. Entries may be mailed or emailed by Closing Date to avoid fee.





HORSE SHOW DIVISIONS – HUNTER DIVISIONS

X-RAIL RIDER: Restricted to junior or adult riders in their first or second consecutive year of showing. If the rider has shown prior to January 2017 or ever shown higher than 18", they are not eligible to compete in this division. The rider may only cross enter into the 18" Beginner Rider Division. Trotting on course is permitted. Fence height is not to exceed 18". Under Saddle class will be Walk/Trot only. Division consists of three classes: Hunter Over Fences, Equitation Over Fences, and Equitation on the Flat.

18" BEGINNER RIDER: Restricted to junior or adult riders in their first or second consecutive year of showing in this division. If the rider has shown in this division prior to January 2017 or ever shown higher than 2', they are not eligible to compete in this division. The rider may cross enter into any division where jumps do not exceed 2'. Trotting on course is permitted but cantering is encouraged. Fence height is 18". No combinations or oxers. Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot only. Division consists of five classes: Hunter Over Fences x2, Equitation Over Fences, Hunter Under Saddle, and Equitation on the Flat.

2' GREEN HORSE: Restricted to horses/ponies in their first or second consecutive year of showing. If the horse has shown in any division prior to January 2017 or has ever shown higher than 2'3", they are not eligible to compete in this division. The horse/pony may cross enter into divisions with a fence height not exceeding 2'3". Fence height 2'. No combinations or oxers. Under Saddle class will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of three classes: Hunter Over Fences x2 and Hunter Under Saddle.

2' LIMIT RIDER: Restricted to junior or adult riders who have never shown any horse/pony over 2'3". If the rider has shown any horse/pony over 2'3" at any time, they are not eligible to compete in this division. The rider may cross enter into any divisions with a fence height not exceeding 2'3". Fence height 2'. No combinations or oxers. Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of five classes: Hunter Over Fences x2, Equitation Over Fences, Hunter Under Saddle, and Equitation on the Flat.

2' THOROUGHBRED HUNTER: Open to junior or adult riders riding TIP eligible Thoroughbreds. No other restrictions. Will run concurrent with the Limit Rider Division. Fence height 2'. No combinations or oxers. Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of three classes: Hunter Over Fences x2 and Hunter Under Saddle.

2'3" SCHOOLING: Open to horses/ponies ridden by juniors or adults not restricted by another division at the same show. Fence height 2'3". No combinations. Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of five classes: Hunter Over Fences x2, Equitation Over Fences, Hunter Under Saddle, and Equitation on the Flat.

2'6" INTERMEDIATE: Open to horses/ponies ridden by juniors or adults not restricted by another division at the same show. Fence height 2'6". Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of five classes: Hunter Over Fences x2, Equitation Over Fences, Hunter Under Saddle, and Equitation on the Flat.

2'6" THOROUGHBRED HUNTER: Open to junior or adult riders riding TIP eligible Thoroughbreds. No other restrictions. Will run concurrent with the 2'6" Intermediate Division. Fence height 2'6". Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of three classes: Hunter Over Fences x2 and Hunter Under Saddle.

2'9" – 3'0" LOW: Open to horses/ponies ridden by juniors or adults not restricted by another division at the same show. Fence height 2'9"-3'0". Under Saddle classes will be Walk/Trot/Canter. Division consists of five classes: Hunter Over Fences x2, Equitation Over Fences, Hunter Under Saddle, and Equitation on the Flat.



HORSE SHOW DIVISIONS – JUMPER DIVISIONS

HOPEFUL JUMPER: Open to horses/ponies ridden by juniors or adults not restricted by another division at the same show. Fence height 2'6"-2'9". Division consists of two classes.

2'6" THOROUGHBRED JUMPER: Open to junior or adult riders riding TIP eligible Thoroughbreds not restricted by another division at the same show. Fence height 2'6"-2'9". Division consists of two classes.

SCHOOLING JUMPER: Open to horses/ponies ridden by juniors or adults not restricted by another division at the same show. Fence height 2'9"-3'. Division consists of two classes.

CROSS-ENTERING DIVISIONS

With the exception of TIP Divisions, each horse/rider combination may only cross-enter into divisions with fence heights of a three-inch difference.

This includes the Under Saddle classes.

SHOWING UNJUDGED

If a rider/horse is not eligible to enter a certain division but would like to ride for training purposes, they are welcome to enter for the cost of the normal entry fees but the ride must be "UNJUDGED".



POINTS AND AWARDS

Points are awarded as follows:

1 st Place = 10 points	4 th Place = 2 points
2 nd Place = 6 points	5 th Place = 1 point
3 rd Place = 4 points	6 th Place = ½ point

SHOW AWARDS

- Ribbons to 8th place given in all classes. Participation ribbons will be awarded to all entries in the X-Rail Division.
- Divisions may be split and double pinned if 16 entries compete in the first class of the division.
- Champion & Reserve are awarded in all divisions held with 3 or more entries. Divisions may be combined at the discretion of show management.

SHOW CHAMPIONSHIPS

- To be eligible for a show Champion or Reserve Champion, a horse/rider combination must have entered into all of the classes in the entire division.
- Membership is not required for Show Championships.
- Show Division Champions & Reserves are awarded to the horse/rider combination that accumulates the highest & second highest number of points in all classes in the division.
- In the event of a tie for Champion or Reserve Champion in any Hunter division, the entry who has the most points over fences will be on top. If there is a tie in over fences points, there will be a coin toss as a tiebreaker.
- In the event of a tie for Champion or Reserve Champion in any Jumper Division, there will be a coin toss as a tiebreaker.

YEAR-END AWARDS

- In addition to the awards and prizes given out at each of our shows, AHJA members are eligible to compete for cumulative year-end awards.
- Year-end award points accumulate from the date the annual membership fee is paid.
- Riders must have participated in at least three shows or two shows and one clinic/other AHJA event to be eligible for year-end awards
- **Volunteer requirement.** Each member must contribute four volunteer hours to be eligible for year-end awards. Hours may be completed by member or member's family.
- **Available AHJA Year-End Awards:** Participation Award, Class Champions & Reserve Champions, Division Awards, High Point Rider, High Point Jumper, High Point Horse.
- **USHJA Affiliate Awards:** Year-end equitation awards given to the high point riders that are AHJA members and also USHJA Outreach, USHJA Collegiate or USHJA Regular Members. Two awards will be offered: AHJA Mini-Medal and AHJA Medal.
 - **AHJA Mini-Medal:** Awarded at the year-banquet to the riders earning highest cumulative points in classes #8 Beginner Rider Equitation Over Fences or #17 Limit Rider Equitation Over Fences.
 - **AHJA Medal:** Top riders based on cumulative points in classes #23 Schooling Equitation Over Fences, #29 Intermediate Equitation Over Fences, and #35 Low Equitation Over Fences will be invited to participate in a special Equitation Over Fences class at our last show to determine the final winner (riders will show at either 2'3", 2'6" or 2'9").

AHJA Rules

MEMBERSHIP

1. There is an **annual membership fee**. The fee shall be \$20 per year for an individual membership or \$25 per year for a family membership. Year-end award points accumulate from the date the annual membership fee is paid. Membership is not required for Show Level Championships.
2. Riders must have participated in at least three shows to be eligible for year-end awards
3. **Volunteer requirement.** Each member must contribute four volunteer hours to be eligible for year-end awards. Hours may be completed by member or member's family.

SHOW REGISTRATION:

4. Class Fees: \$15 per class for members, \$25 flat nonmember fee.
5. **CLOSING DATE: Post entries received after the Wednesday preceding the Saturday show date will be charged \$35 per entry.**
6. Each entry pays \$5 Office/EIA Verifier and \$10 Facility Fee.
7. Each rider must register with the show secretary and be assigned a number before schooling or the start of their divisions. One number will be assigned for each horse which must be shared by all riders of that horse at a given show. Please remit payment or an open check at that time. Credit Cards will be accepted at a fee of \$3.25 per transaction. A credit card with valid expiration date must be presented to receive show number.
8. Entries are made and received by show management as to eligibility on the Honor System. Entries may be evaluated by show management as to class eligibility and will notify entries of ineligibility at that show before competition for that class begins. If horse/rider proves to be ineligible for the class/division ridden, points received will not count towards year-end awards.
9. Each horse/rider combo may only cross enter into divisions with fence heights of a three (3) inch difference. This includes the under saddle classes. X-rail riders may only cross enter into the 18" division. Jumper riders may cross enter into any jumper class at any height.
10. Should there be less than three riders in a division, management reserves the right to combine divisions with the division immediately above or below in height. Points will count towards year end awards in the division entered, regardless of whether divisions are combined.

CLASSES:

11. All classes will be conducted and judged in accordance with the current rules and regulations of the Association. All rules will stand for the year.
12. No persons will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging, except those who have duties to perform.
13. All horses and ponies must be serviceably sound. Any lameness, or impairment, which interferes with the performance of the animal, will be considered unsoundness and the horse/pony will be excused from the class. The final determination of soundness is at the discretion of the judge.
14. Any horse/pony that is uncontrollable or considered dangerous may be asked to leave the ring.
15. After 3 refusals in an over fences class please excuse yourself from the ring.
16. There will be a 1-minute gate limit to wait for entrants in any class, unless the announcer is notified of a tack change well in advance, where a maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed. Please leave yourself plenty of time to prepare for classes.

SHOWGROUNDS:

17. AHJA requires a 12 month negative Coggins upon arrival at the show grounds. Only originals accepted.
18. All exhibitors' and spectators' dogs MUST be on a leash or otherwise confined, and must be well behaved at all times or they will be asked to leave the show grounds. We encourage them to be left at home.
19. Children are to be supervised at all times. Please do not allow children to run on the bleachers, run among horses around the arena and at trailers, or hang on arena fence.
20. Spectators must remain well clear of the in gate area. This area is for competitors and trainers only. Spectator vehicles to be parked in designated areas only.

ATTIRE:

21. All riders must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet while mounted on the show grounds, inside and outside the show ring.
22. Any rider may choose to wear an equestrian body protector vest in any class without penalty from the judge.
23. Appropriate show ring attire is encouraged, but not required. Heeled shoes, sleeved shirts or polo shirts, jodhpurs, or breeches, and approved helmets are required. No T-shirts, jeans, or tank tops.
24. Tack should be appropriate to the discipline. Schooling pads may be used. No protective horse boots, flash or figure eight nosebands in any hunter division. Boots are allowed in Equitation classes. No martingales in flat classes. No training devices in any class.

SCHOOLING:

25. Friday Schooling is available the day before the show at 2pm to 7pm. Please call ahead.
26. Pre-show Schooling schedule: Open Schooling 7am to 8am; X-rail schooling only 7:45am to 8:00am.
27. When schooling, horses that are jumping have the right of way. When traveling in opposite directions, stay to the right, as if driving a car. Please be sure to call all fences. No lunging of horses in the arena. **See expanded Schooling Rules.**

OTHER:

28. Stallions will not be permitted at any AHJA show.
29. Riders, trainers, handlers and/or owners committing an abusive act (like excessive use of whip) to animals, or acting in any unsportsmanlike manner will be asked to leave the grounds by show management.
30. AHJA reserves the right to refuse show entry and/or cancel membership due to the inhumane treatment of animals, un-sportsmanlike behavior, indebtedness to AHJA, and/or disorderly conduct.



SCHOOLING INSTRUCTIONS

SCHOOLING TIMES:

There will be Friday schooling available the day before the show from 2pm to 7pm. Please call ahead to let us know you plan on coming.

There will be two schooling sessions in the ring the morning of the show.

Session 1: beginning 7am and ending 7:45 am.

Session 2: 7:45am-8:00am for X-rail division entries **ONLY**

SCHOOLING RULES:

No more than 8 to 10 riders will be allowed in the ring at any time. Each group will be limited to 10-15 minutes in the ring as numbers and time allow. The number of riders in the ring may be changed at show management's discretion.

Sign-up for a schooling time slot at the show is with the secretary on a first come basis only.

An entry must be registered and number received to school. Number is worn by rider to school.

Start and end times of schooling slot to be governed by schooling supervisor.

Whistle may be used to indicate a dangerous situation– if whistle is blown, riders are to walk or halt and await further instructions.

Not all jumps in the ring will be available for schooling. Jumps will only be available to jump on one direction.

Jumps being used for schooling in the ring will be marked, and are to be jumped with a red flag/marker on the right, a white flag/marker on the left.

Management will have at least two warm-up jumps set up outside the ring for competitor's use.

Exhibitors are encouraged to enter the WARM UP CLASS #9, #18, #24, #34, a non-judged round run prior to the first class in each hunter division starting with the 2' height.
